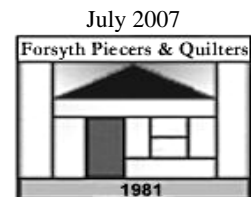

## A FEW WORDS ABOUT SEWING SAFETY

Hopefully, most of us know already to be careful letting stray pins or needles fall on the floor. (Is your dog, cat or child limping around? Do you have a baby that crawls on the floor? They may need an x-ray to find out if it is a sewing needle or straight pin in their foot.) And, most of us keep that rotary cutter blade closed or in the safe-lock position as soon as one finishes using it. I ran a search of the medical literature about sewing needles and here are some items that I came across. I hope this discourages everyone from holding sewing needles or straight pins in the mouth. The fact of the matter is: accidentally swallowing a needle or pin can be disastrous in rare circumstances. Anyone who has swallowed a pin or needle needs to see their doctor for an x-ray. If, you think you may have swallowed a pin, or landed a pin in your foot, even 12 months ago or more it's not too late to get an x-ray. Ideally, the pin or needle would move through your digestive system without incident, but the fact is, that pins can migrate to all kinds of places in the body. Pins and needles: have migrated to the voicebox, have punctured the spinal cord, have resulted in the removal of a bronchus, have punctured the liver, have caused lung collapse and appendicitis. Sewing needles have been found in the bladder, have migrated to the heart, causing a deadly irregular heartbeat, have caused gastrointestinal bleeding, and have migrated from the foot to the knee. So please sew safely, and if you see someone with pins in their mouth, remind them about sewing safety.
