Quilt Entries – All entries are due to Lisa Alley by Sunday June 8. Quilts may be dropped off at Sew Original on Robinhood Road during regular business hours. On June 8 from 1:00 – 7:00 they can be delivered to Lisa at 2749 Maplewood Avenue. Directions to Lisa's house are from Business 40 take the Knollwood exit. Turn south toward Stratford Road. Cross Stratford Road and after the traffic light at Queen Street, take the 3<sup>rd</sup> right onto Maplewood Avenue. 2749 is the 9<sup>th</sup> house on the right. It is a small white house just past a big brown house. Remember that each entry must be placed in a pillowcase with the name of the quilt, entrant's name and phone number clearly labeled on the outside of the pillowcase. Quilts that are smaller than 4 feet (48 inches) must have a hanging device (slat, dowel, etc.) in the sleeve. Label it with the quilt name, entrant's name and phone number in case it gets separated from the quilt.

*Drop those feed dogs and learn to free-motion some easy (and not-so-easy) all over designs that will make your quilts look like you and your personality! We will also do some stencil exploration. Saturday, 6/14 @ 10 -4, Cost: \$60, Teacher: Kay Preston*

#### Feathered Star

*One of the loveliest of all blocks, the Feathered Star is impressive as it is beautiful. Learn to piece the elegant Radiant Star the modern way with rotary cutting and fast bias triangles. We will use Marsha McCloskey's techniques and her book. So by the end of our day you will be ready to piece any of the eight pointed feathered star varieties in her book. Please Read Carefully

1. Entrants must be members of the Forsyth Piecers and Quilters Guild as of the February 2008 membership meeting.
2. Each entered item must have its own entry form.
3. Entries cannot have been entered in a previous Forsyth Piecers and Quilters Guild quilt show.
4. Entry must have been completed within the previous five (5) years.
5. Items must be quilted items (i.e. no knitted, crocheted or other crafts will be accepted)
6. The show committee and/or judges reserve the right to divide or combine categories and to move entries to a more appropriate category. Hand, domestic machine and professionally long arm quilts may be judged separately.
7. Prioritize multiple entries in the event that more entries are received than can be displayed.
8. Entries must be completed and clean.
9. All bed quilts and wall quilts must have a four inch hanging sleeve securely attached.
10. Entries must have a label on the back lower left corner with the quilt name, maker name, address and phone number. Cover the label with a separate piece of muslin.
11. Entry forms must be received no later than May 19, 2008.
